

The HiSet Test Battery – 5 Tests

HiSet tests are usually done in two four-hour sessions at a Community Education Testing Center.

The complete official HiSet Test Battery consists of 5 sub-tests:

1. Math -90 min-50 multiple choice questions
2. Language Arts – Writing – 2 Parts
Multiple Choice (1 Hr.-15 min.)
Written essay (45 min)
3. Science – 80 min-50 multiple choice questions
4. Social Studies – 70 min-50 multiple choice questions
5. Language Arts – Reading – 65 min-40 multiple choice question

Time limits given are maximum time available, however some candidates may finish earlier. Accommodations may be available for people with documented disabilities. Both computer-based, paper-based or a combination of both are available.

Accommodations are available for test takers with disabilities or health-related needs. Accommodations can be obtained directly from ETS (HiSet) by following the steps outlined on this webpage:

REGISTRATION

To register for the HiSet, you must **first** create an on-line **HiSet account:**
www.http://hiset.ets.org/test_takers/

If you attend Project LIFT, we can help with this process. If you have questions trying to register from home, please call ETS at:

1-855-MyHiSET (1-855-694-4788) for issues setting up your on-line account.

Once you are ready to test, you can then pay for the exam at a testing center and schedule test dates.

IMPORTANT!!! You will need a government issued photo ID and cash or money order at the time of registration to the testing center of your choice.

If you are at least 16 years of age or older, you may take the HiSet with permission from the high school you are registered with. Please contact your guidance counselor or Project LIFT for more specific information. *****

The HiSet can be taken in Keene at Community Ed. @ 603-357-9041 or in Concord at Second Start @ 603-228-1341. The HiSet replaces the GED test in NH.

What Is A Passing HiSet Score?

In order to pass the HiSet and obtain a New Hampshire High School Equivalency Certificate, all 3 of the following criteria must be met:

(Note: A perfect score is 20 for each of the 5 subtests).

- 1. Minimum of 8 to pass any one test.**
- 2. Average score of 9 or better.**
- 3. Total combined score of 45 or higher.**

** COST **

The full battery of tests costs \$95.00. Can retake for a cost up to 2 times.

Time limit of one year from when you pay for the test to finish all subtests. May be taken one test at a time.

Can schedule to pay for and take one test at a time.
